Rezoning of elementary school campuses was a hot topic of discussion at the last DRHCC Monthly Membership meeting hosted by SFDRCISD. Dr. Carlos H. Rios noted that over time various elementary schools were experiencing overcrowding due to population growth. SFDRCISD faced with these tough challenges were forced to give up some specialized rooms for art and science labs and use them as additional classrooms, request waivers from the Texas Education Agency, address increase problems with traffic safety, while tocusing on student achievement.

Two key initiatives were also implemented: 1) to reduce the number of non-resident students and 2) reduce the number of students assigned to campuses outside of their residential zones by limiting the number of transfer requests. Statistical data showed that the difficult decision of rezoning would also need to take place to address population growth and safety of students, particularly at Garfield and Buena Vista Elementary schools. In addition future plans recommended by a Citizens' Committee include building two additional elementary schools with a K-6 environment and repurposing San Felipe Middle School as a 6-8 STEM Magnet School. Upcoming changes included a

This facility will be the SFDRCISD Student Activity Center and administrative center with a capacity for over 500 guests Dr. Rios also mentioned that the decision for campus rezoning is not a school board decision and in a state of the art facility.

is left to the discretion of the Superintendent by the State to avoid political influences. Dr. Rios also introduced his administrative cabinet. This was a very informative presentation with many photos to support vision of "Building Success for the Future."

Demographic data indicates that in the 2014-15 school year, 19% of our current elementary students were not enrolled at their residential campus.



## **EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE- DUTIES:**

THE PRESIDENT SHALL: (according to by-laws - Must have served at least 1 year as a Director)

- (1) Prepare, call and preside at each meeting of the DRHCC.
- (2) Provide an agenda for each meeting.
- (3) Enforce the rules relating to debate and order.
- (4) Appoint committee directors and other Board appointments as needed.
- (5) Oversee the work of the Board and their respective committees.
- (6) Monitor, through the Executive Director, the work of the DRHCC.
- (7) Represent, along with the Executive Director the DRHCC in matters of public relations.
- (8) Serve as an ex-officio member of all committees except for the Nominating Committee.
- (9) Have at each meeting, in addition to other papers necessary for the meeting, the following: a copy of Robert's Rules of Order and a list of all standing and special committees and their members.
- (10) Perform all other duties associated with this office.

#### THE VICE PRESIDENT SHALL:

- (1) In the absence of the President perform all duties of the President.
- (2) In case of the resignation, removal or death of the President assume the office of the President automatically, serving the unexpired term of the President

### DIRECTORS - DUTIES - AS PER CURRENT BY-LAWS:

7.04 The duties of each position shall be such as this title by general usage indicates, as well as those duties specified by the President. The Directors of each committee shall present a monthly report to the President. In addition, each Director is responsible for producing, submitting and updating an annual budget to the Chair of Finance.

### (A) THE DIRECTOR OF FINANCE SHALL: (FUNDRAISING)

- (1) Plan and coordinate with the President and Treasurer all the Chamber's fundraising efforts,
- (2) Oversee all solicitations from all other Director Committees.
- (3) Be responsible for providing the format of the annual budget to each Board Director and to oversee committee expenses.

## (C) DIRECTOR OF ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT & SMALL BUSINESS SHALL:

- (1) Seek opportunities which will assist minority and small businesses in the area of growth and development.
- (2) Work closely with the President in coordinating seminars, workshops, etc., which will help to enhance entrepreneurial and management skills. Continue the solicitation and/or procurement of public and private contracts through Minority Business Enterprise programs.
- (3) Recommend educational programs of the business and economic for Chamber members, volunteers, staff and officers.
- (4) Promote our corporate sponsors and members, through all means, including coordination with the Texas Association of Mexican-American Chambers of Commerce and the United States Hispanic Chambers of Commerce.

### (D) DIRECTOR OF MEMBERSHIP SHALL:

- Recruit membership throughout the year and conduct a maximum of two well-structured membership drives.
- (2) Establish and actively promote the Ambassador program.
- (3) Assemble information on business anniversaries, grand openings, relocations, etc., and offer ribbon cuttings and other special recognition activities, which will include the "Small Business of the Month."

### (E) DIRECTOR OF CULTURAL ISSUES & EVENTS SHALL:

- (1) Is responsible for the organization of scheduled annual events that promote the Chamber's mission.
- (2) Support and participate in cultural events that are intrinsic to the Hispanic market.

## (J) DIRECTOR OF HEALTH ISSUES

- (1) Promote physical and mental health in the community and actively support stress management programs in the workplace.
- (2) Keep the members
